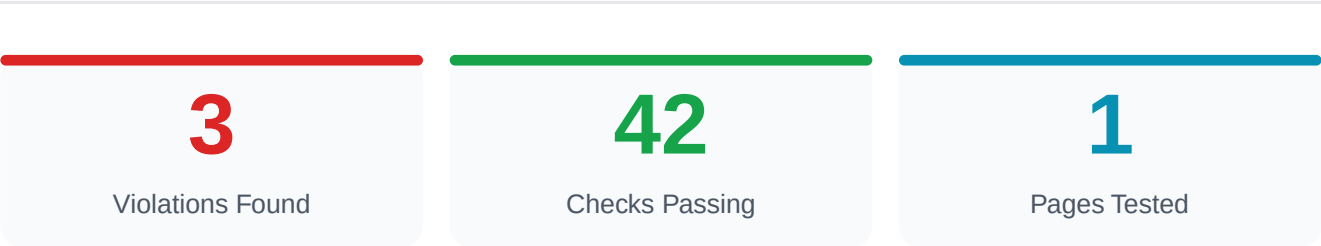

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report identified 3 accessibility violations and 42 passing checks across 1 page. Tested against WCAG 2.2 Level AA using axe-core automated analysis combined with manual screen reader verification.

WHAT THIS MEANS

Images missing alt text

Screen reader users will encounter images with no description, hearing only "image" or nothing at all. Blind users cannot access the information these images convey. This is a Level A failure and among the most commonly cited ADA web violations.

Form inputs missing labels

Form fields without programmatic labels force screen reader users to guess what information to enter. Voice control users also cannot reliably target unlabeled fields. This directly impairs task completion for users with disabilities.

Color contrast ratio below 4.5:1

Text that does not meet the 4.5:1 contrast ratio threshold is difficult or impossible to read for users with low vision or color blindness. This affects an estimated 8% of men and 0.5% of women globally.

Fix the 3 automated violations above — your development team can address each in under an hour.

Commission a full manual audit to uncover the 60–70% of accessibility barriers automated tools cannot detect — including screen reader reading order, keyboard navigation flows, and cognitive accessibility failures.
